

Lake Erie's Walleye Fishing was record-breaking in 2025

In the New York waters of Lake Erie, it was a recording-breaking year for walleye fishing. The catch rate was the best-ever for this Great Lake. According to DEC's open lake creel census, the walleye catch rate of 11 fish per trip was tops in the 38-year history of the survey. Two in five walleye trips caught their limits, with an estimated total catch of over 230,000 walleyes boated in 2025. Because of this fantastic walleye fishing, the Greater Niagara Fishing Expo will be changing things up to provide the opportunity for more anglers to enjoy this fantastic Eastern Basin walleye fishery, no matter what your skill level.

The Eastern Lake Erie Walleye School returns to the Greater Niagara Fishing Expo February 19-22, 2026, at the Niagara Falls Convention Center in Niagara Falls, NY – but with a new and unique twist. The changes include new content and format, multiple instructors in each class, and, best of all, it is included with general admission to the Expo! These customized classes will be taught by Capt.
